

LEIGH ADAMS - A LIFE IN PERSPECTIVE



Leigh Adams spent over twenty years racing at the top of international motorcycle speedway riding all over the planet achieving individual and team honours that saw him earn a reputation as one of the sport's greatest ever riders.

For a scrawny kid riding around the fruit blocks of Mildura on his modest dirt bike Adams built an elite dream career that

saw him travel the world competing in front of crowds in the tens of thousands.

The chant "Leigh, Leigh Adams!" echoed around his Polish stadium in particular, sung by the majority of the 50,000 strong fans.

"I don't remember actually making a conscious decision to race professionally," Leigh recalls, "I was a kid racing down here at Olympic Park Speedway against my hero Phil Crump and that was all I thought about to begin with. That was enough at the time."

For the then sixteen-year-old the rest of the Speedway planet would soon come calling and initially in England Adams would begin forging a career as one of Australia's best

"It all just began happening as a sequence," he explains, "I started off in England and then you start branching off into other parts of the world in Europe riding individually and for teams. Suddenly you look up and you've added a lot of incredible places that you raced. At the time it was just race race and race. You never gave it much more thought than that."

As the miles added up so did the distinctions however both internationally and at home.

"I always made a point of coming home to Australia and racing," he says, "many of the Aussies racing overseas were ready to come back home and take some time off the bike but I felt like I owed the people who helped me get there, whether that was family, sponsors, fans or even the grader driver. And the Mildura Motorcycle Club where it all began. I always looked forward to racing in Australia after my international season was finished each year."

That dedication to race 'at home' in Australia would see Leigh collect an unprecedented ten Australian Championship wins – a record to this day that will probably never be beaten.

Adams would always return to the cold weather in Europe each year however and build on his commitments and reputation.

He won eight "Speedway Grand Prix" rounds and was runner up in the World Championship in 2007.

His runner up place in the World Title takes pride of place over his ten Aussie titles.

"It's just a much harder challenge, racing in the World Championship over so many rounds, compared to the Aussie title battle. Don't get me wrong, I'm very proud of my record in Australian Championships but to be ranked number two in the world at the time in 2007 was something very hard to accomplish."

In a career spanning over two decades he would go on to ride in Italy, the UK, Sweden, Russia, Poland, Czech Republic, Latvia, Denmark, Slovenia, Croatia, Germany, Finland, Norway and France.

"Everything is so close on that side of the world. Neighbouring countries can be a car ride away or a short flight," he explains, "with the exception of some remote locations in Russia we rode in most countries are a car or short plane ride away. The list adds up when you look back on it though I guess. It's hard to get your head around that when you live in Australia because every country and even every State of our country is so far away."

He was a member of the 2001 and 2002 World Team Cup winning line-up, a World Under 21 Champion and won the prestigious Golden Helmet in Czech Republic 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2004.

His career in Poland in particular riding loyally for the giant Unia Leszno Club was a rock star life where he was celebrated like a God in many parts of the country.

At forty years of age he decided it was time to retire however and come home to Australia where he and wife Kylie and children Declyn and Casey could see some of their own country, slow down and do some sight-seeing.

It was also the chance for Leigh to tick off a bucket list and ride in the gruelling Finke Desert Race in the Northern Territory.

The Finke Desert race is an almost 500 kilometre race in some of Australia's most harsh landscape.

To even finish the race is something of an achievement.

In the past it was never possible for Leigh to contemplate racing in it because traditionally he was always racing in Europe in June.

History will show that life took a dramatic change in 2011 when Leigh crashed in practice and was tragically paralysed confining him to a wheelchair.

It was a powerful irony given how many years he had dreamed of competing in it.

Fans may argue that Leigh's greatest attributes were heralded on the Speedway track however it would be just as easy to argue that his strength in coming to terms with paralysis is much higher on the list.

"You just have to play the cards you've been dealt really," Leigh explains, "you just have to get on with it don't you. History will show that some of the greatest times of my life have happened during my life in a wheelchair. There's no use looking at it any other way."

The Finke accident changed his entire life, and also seemingly took off the table another bucket list item.

Leigh had always harboured a dream of racing a nine hundred horsepower Sprintcar.

He'd always been a fan.

"I'd wanted to drive a Sprintcar since the first time I saw them," he says, "their power and speed is just insane. The timing for me in Australia had never worked out to drive one and now being paralysed (with no real mobility in his legs) meant the idea of doing that was nearly impossible.

A family in Bendigo Victoria Australia had other ideas though.

Ten years after Leigh's crash at Finke father and son team Darren and Rusty Hickman reconfigured Rusty's Sprintcar with hand controls to allow Leigh to finally take the wheel and do some laps around his local Timmis Speedway in Mildura.

"I can't tell you how much that experience means to me to this day," Leigh smiles, "to finally achieve that dream. It was something I never believed would be possible. The Hickman family took the 'dis' out of disability. They just made it happen. I'll never be able to repay them for the life experience they provided."

It was decided, only days out before the drive, to document the experience on film.

Mildura bred Bendigo based Daniel Dea was brought to co-shoot and produce a documentary from scratch.

"Leigh Adams Driven to Drive" is an emotional movie that covers his Speedway career, his accident and subsequent rehabilitation, and him finally taking the wheel of a Sprintcar on the ten year anniversary of the Finke crash.

"Looking back on it I'm so glad we filmed the Sprintcar drive," Leigh says, "the footage is there forever now and I'm really proud of how it came together."

The film has been shown at two premieres – one in Coomealla in front of 200 plus of his friends and family and one in Warrnambool – and is now airing on Fox Sports in Australia.

It is currently available through the Methanol Moonshine website also.

Fans and critics throughout the world have embraced the film which has now enabled them to look back on Adams' stellar international career and also get a rare insight into his rehab and life since international Speedway.

"I never understood what he'd gone through and what driving a Sprintcar really meant to him," said Warrnambool Classic winner and established Aussie Sprintcar superstar Corey McCullagh. I have so much respect for Leigh and the Hickman family for what they did for Leigh. It's a fantastic movie."

The Adams and Hickman families have since become lifelong friends.

A legacy of the time they shared and the emotion that bonded them during Leigh's life-changing drive.

The whole experience was neatly 'bow tied' off for both families with a special opportunity to drive the #40 car for the National Anthem parade lap at the Warrnambool Classic earlier last year.

"That was nerve wracking," Leigh smiles, "to idle around in Mildura is one thing but to idle around at Australia's



holy grail of Sprintcars Premier Speedway in front of 9,000 people is something else. I was pretty nervous to be honest. I felt all those nerves again from the first time I drove the car in Mildura. What an experience and what an opportunity."

Life for Leigh Adams these days has hardly slowed down much.

He likes to tinker in his shed but even that is hardly pedestrian.

Adams heads up the race prep and maintenance for the multi-bike STE Desert Racing Team where his daughter Casey's partner Callum Norton spearheads with Adams' great mate Jason Stewart at the ownership helm.

He also preps and maintains many MX, Desert racing and even occasionally Junior Speedway motorcycles (he built his own brand of chassis some time ago that are still on the market) – all from his 'man cave' shed in Irymple.

He loves a good coffee (with the occasional slice or cake), watching ALL forms of motorsport – he's obsessed with all forms of two, three and four wheel motor racing – and his beloved Carlton Blues.

Wife Kylie is the Adams Family Team Manager and has been for two plus decades, running the family home and a lot of Leigh's racing and travel commitments to this day.

Son Declyn is a respected and revered factory Motocross and Desert Racing mechanic in Australia and rode for a time in Speedway before deciding the other side of the handlebars (mechanic-wise) was suited to him.

Daughter Casey works for an accounting firm in Mildura and supports her partner Callum Norton.

She's also a pretty handy singer if you can ever cajole her into a rendition for you.

Life may have changed course, but in many ways it hasn't slowed down much for Leigh and the Adams family.

He's humble and uncomfortable with the adulation that comes with a rider of his international stature.

Gifted with a wicked sense of humour, a mind like a steel trap, a methodical mechanical approach with a penchant for cleaning everything thoroughly (his son Dec has inherited that as well in spades) Leigh is a luminary in the sport of Speedway over a decade since he retired as a rider.

His fans, and certainly his friends know that he's one of the immortals of Australian Motorsport.

His wife Kylie just wishes he'd pick up the tea towel occasionally...







MECCANO HORNBY TRAIN DISPLAY



WENTWORTH SHOW SOCIETY INC. RULES AND REGULATIONS

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH INDIVIDUAL SECTION RULES.

- The Wentworth Show Society will not tolerate any unreasonable behaviour towards judges, stewards or any other Wentworth Show Society volunteers. This includes bullying, harassment, adverse behaviour or offensive language. Any person involved in these sorts of behaviours will be escorted from the showgrounds at the discretion of the disputes committee and may be banned from future shows.
- Wentworth Show Society Inc will not tolerate any malicious comments made on social media which includes, but is not limited to: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, TikTok, Blogs, Forums, Discussion Boards and Groups (public, private or restricted), which may ultimately bring Wentworth Show Society Inc, it's events, volunteers, sponsors and competitors into disrepute. If any instances occur, action may be taken
- Entries will be accepted only on this condition, that the Society is not held responsible for any accident or damage by or to any exhibit and owners shall accept responsibility in this respect.
- 4. If the Stewards are of the opinion that any exhibit or work is not the bona fide property of the exhibitor or that the particulars, as stated in the entry form, are not correct, such exhibit shall not be eligible for a prize.
- Intending exhibitors must place their entries in the hands of the Secretary within dates to be fixed by the Committee of the Show and unless complied with exhibits will be refused.
- No single exhibit shall be entitled to more than one first prize, except in certain classes fixed by the Committee. Horse sections specially excepted.
- 7. In the competition for prizes, no first will be given unless there are two exhibits, and no second unless there are three, except where the judges unanimously (giving their reasons) recommend on the merit of the exhibit. The judges may withhold any prize where the exhibit does not merit an award in their opinion, giving their reasons for same. They may recommend for "Certificate of Merit" any exhibit of special merit or excellence for which no prize is offered in the Schedule.
- 8. Any exhibit appearing with medal or label, or distinguishing badge or brands (other than brands on livestock) prior to the prizes being awarded, will be disqualified, nor can any badge be worn subsequently other than that awarded at the Show, always subject to the ruling of the Committee or the Stewards.
- Show exhibitors expect that animals attending shows are healthy and that returning stock won't introduce diseases onto their own properties, herds or flocks as a result of cross infection at shows. The Society therefore requires minimum standards of exhibitors which are outlined below.
- 10. Animals may not enter the 2022 Wentworth Show from flocks/herds with a disease status of suspect or infected. All stock entering the showgrounds must have the relevant animal health certification (see below) which is required to be sent to the Chief Steward at least 2 weeks prior to arrival at the show. All sections of the health certification must be completed. A copy of the health certification must be retained by the exhibitor and is required to accompany the stock on shipment day.
- 11. No dog is permitted at the Wentworth Showgrounds for the duration of the show, with the exception of registered service dogs, and dogs entered into a competition. Any dog on-site must be restrained at all times. Offending dogs and owners will be removed
- 12. Drones are not permitted at Wentworth Show
- 13. Unregistered electric vehicles are prohibited on Wentworth Showgrounds with the exception of approved mobility aids.
- 14. Owners/exhibitors of Sheep, Goats and Cattle must provide an NVD/TSS to the show organiser. The show organiser will complete a Property to Property (P2P) transfers (if at the Show for 3 or more days) or Sighted livestock transfer (Less than 3 days) for cattle, or a mob-based movement for sheep / goats onto and off the Wentworth showground PIC (as the receiver of the stock). All cattle NLIS transfers post show will transfer the animals back to the same PIC unless otherwise arranged with the show organiser. For more information please see NLIS Guidelines for NSW shows and sporting events.

SHEEP

BEFORE UNLOADING any sheep, owners/handlers must report to the Chief Steward. A copy of the National Sheep Health Declaration (Version 5, March 2017), previously sent (refer item 9 above) will be reviewed by the Chief Steward before unloading.

Please Note:

1. Section B: FOOTROT/LICE/OVINE BRUCELLOSIS

The owner declares that the sheep displayed are from a flock that is free of VIRULENT FOOTROT and LICE. The owner declares that the rams displayed are from a flock in the OVINE BRUCELLOSIS Scheme. It is a requirement of the Wentworth Show Committee that if the rams are not part of an Accredited Ovine Brucellosis free flock then they have been blood tested with Negative results to CFT. These results will need to be certified by the private or government veterinarian who carried out the testing and the paperwork supplied to the Chief Steward.

2. Section C: OVINE JOHNE'S DISEASE (OJD)

The owner declares that "to the best of my knowledge, all consigned sheep are from a **flock that is not** suspected of being infected with OJD".

Sheep attending the show MUST be housed, fed and watered separately from all other stock at the show.

Stockowner Obligations re National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) sheep -

Sheep that are moved to and from the Wentworth Show must all be tagged before leaving their property or showground. All movements must be accompanied by a Travelling Stock Statement (TSS) or National Vendor Declaration/Waybill (NVD/ Waybill Sheep).

All movement documents must be retained by the owner or person in charge of the sheep for 7 years, as for any other property to property movement. GOATS

BEFORE UNLOADING any goat/s, owners/handlers must report to the Chief Steward. A copy of the National Goat Health Declaration, previously sent (refer item 9 above) will be reviewed by the Chief Stewart before unloading.

All sections of the NGHD need to be completed.

Please Note

Section 4 - OTHER HEALTH INFORMATION, Q9.

Is the herd CAPRINE ARTHRITIS ENCEPHALITIS (CAE) ACCREDITED FREE? Or does the flock comply with the requirements of Section 4 on the NGHS? **CAE accredited flocks should be housed separate from goats from flocks of lower status.**

Stockowner obligations re National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) Goats -

Goats that are moved to and from the Wentworth Show must all be tagged before leaving their property or showground. Dairy breed goats registered with the Dairy Goat Society of Australia (DGSA) are exempt from tagging if attending the show and returning to the property of origin, but must be tagged if sold and returned to another property. All dairy goats must be tattooed with a DGSA registered brand before leaving their property of origin. All tattoos must be fully healed before entry onto the show ground. VICTORIAN ORIGIN SHEEP AND GOATS

From 1 January 2022 all sheep and non-exempt goats, regardless of age, must be individually identified with an electronic NLIS (Sheep) tag (eID) before leaving a Victorian property.

In practice

Sheep/Goats from VIC exhibited at a show in NSW

- All sheep and goats are to be uploaded as a mob by the show organiser.
- Check number of elDs recorded on the NVD, and if all sheep are identified check answer to Q3 recording of 'other PICs' not necessary
- or contact DPI/LLS for assistance uploading as sheep/goat individual (if wish to keep lifetime traceability)

CATTLE

BEFORE UNLOADING any cattle, owners/handlers must report to the Chief Steward. A copy of the National Cattle Health Declaration (NCHD), (Version 18/10/2017) previously sent (refer item 9 above) will be reviewed by the Chief Stewart before unloading.

Please note:

- As of 1 July 2016, the national approach to Bovine Johne's Disease (BJD) was to remove zoning on account of BJD status
- As of 1 November 2016, the Cattle market Accreditation Program (CattleMAP) ceased to exist.

Consequently, there are no restrictions on entry of beef or dairy cattle into NSW and no cattle remain in quarantine on account of BJD. However, in the interest of the Wentworth Show Exhibitors, if the answer to Question 6 on the NCHD (Are these cattle from a herd or property with an occurrence of Johne's desease (JD) within the last five years? Is YES, the Wentworth Show Society Inc will not allow entry. In addition to this dairy cattle and beef cattle will be housed separately whilst at the show.

Stockowner Obligations re National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) Cattle -

AAll cattle being moved to the show must be identified with an NLIS device before leaving their property. The owner or person in charge of the cattle is responsible for recording the movement of their cattle to the Showground and back to their property within 2 days. **The Wentworth Showground PIC is NA600374.**

All movements must be accompanied by an approved movement document which would be a Travelling Stock Statement (TSS) or National Vendor Declaration/Waybill (NVD/ Waybill Cattle) is required for each leg of the journey. All movement documents must be retained by the owner or person in charge of the stock for 7 years, as for any other property to property movement.

GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS TO PREVENT SPREAD OF JOHNE'S DISEASE.

Make sure your livestock carrier understands the risk of spread of Johne's disease and does not put your animals at risk during transport to and from Wentworth Show.

- Clean vehicle out
- Load and unload to prevent your stock coming in contact with contaminated faeces, food and water.

- Floor of sheds and stalls housing assessed animals will be inspected and cleaned, washed or covered, if necessary, before assessed animals enter the facility.
- Animals will be fed and watered above ground level, to prevent faeces (dung) contaminating their food and water.
- Faecal material will be collected regularly and removed to a place where stock has no access. This is particularly important in laneways.
- Special attention should be paid when cleaning out pens so that animals do not have access to areas, fixtures and bedding that are contaminated by other flocks or herds.
- Equipment used for mucking out will be cleaned regularly to prevent build-up of faeces.
- Sick animals will be isolated if Johne's disease or other infectious disease is considered a possibility.
- All animals need to be adequately supervised to maintain separation.
- Animals are to be restricted to their designated areas by tethering or some other means of restraint, or penning, when not being led.

PIGEONS

Re: Rotavirus pigeon disease

Exhibitors of pigeons may be aware that a highly infectious disease caused by a rotavirus has been detected in pigeons in several Australian states. In order to protect the flocks of our valued pigeon exhibitors the Wentworth Show Society Inc will require a declaration re the status of the exhibitors loft with respect to pigeon Rotavirus. This declaration must be forwarded to the Chief Steward at least 2 weeks prior to arrival at the show.

On 1 July 2017 the NSW Biosecurity Act 2015 ('the Act') and its subordinate legislation commenced.

To provide a framework for the responsibility for biosecurity risk management to be shared among the community, industry and government, the Act establishes a number of 'biosecurity duties'. These are:

- a general biosecurity duty,
- · duties relating to prohibited matter, and
- a duty to notify biosecurity events.

The general biosecurity duty can be found in Part 3 of the Act. Specifically, section 22 of the Act provides:

Any person who deals with biosecurity matter or a carrier and who knows, or ought reasonably to know, the biosecurity risk posed or likely to be posed by the biosecurity matter, carrier or dealing has a biosecurity duty to ensure that, so far as is reasonably practicable, the biosecurity risk is prevented, eliminated or minimised.

An example of a breach of the general biosecurity duty for pigeon owners would be to knowingly move pigeons or their products (e.g. faeces) infected with rotavirus.

A person who fails to discharge the person's duty under the Act is guilty of an offence. Intentional or reckless failure to discharge this duty (Category 1 offence) carries a maximum penalty of:

(a) in the case of an individual -\$1,100,000 or imprisonment for 3 years, or both, and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further penalty of \$137,500 for each day the offence continues, or


(b) in the case of a corporation—\$2,200,000 and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further penalty of \$275,000 for each day the offence continues.

The terms 'biosecurity matter', 'carrier', 'biosecurity risk' and other important terms are defined in Division 2 of Part 2 of the Act and an explanation is provided in Key terms and definitions.



- 15. Protests must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary within six (6) hours after the Judges' decision has been published; and such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of fifty dollars (\$50.00), which shall be forfeited to the Society if the Committee deem the protest frivolous and not proved, the forfeiture to be at the opinion of the Committee. Should the protester fail to put in an appearance either personally or by proxy, the protest shall be disregarded. The same applies to the exhibitor who, failing an appearance, shall forfeit his right to the prize affected by the protest.
- The exhibitor of any animal or article may be required to produce statutory declaration as to the age or purchase from previous owners.
- 17. All single exhibits must bear an entry or exhibit ticket, same ith a pen, pair or collection. In all classes of disputes as to the construction of rules and regulations or by-laws, the same shall be determined by the Committee, and their decision shall be final.
- Any person can show non-competitive exhibits, subject to order of the Committee.
- No person shall be admitted while judging is proceeding, except the Stewards and Secretary.
- All exhibits must be in position and ready for judging at the time printed at the beginning of each section.
- The Committee reserves the right to increase, add, adjust or supplement the prizes or trophies allocated to any class or classes.

- 28. All Stewards must be in attendance at the Showgrounds at the appointed time to receive the exhibits and are responsible that the exhibits are correctly classed; all exhibits placed in each section together ready for judging, and direct Judge to the exhibit he was appointed to judge.
- 29. Stewards must supply Judge with Judging sheets of each respective class and will attend on the Judges to afford any information required, but will not say or do anything to influence their decision. They must not reveal the name of the owner of any exhibit or repeat any remarks the Judges may make to each other.
- 30. 

RECIPE FOR COOKERY SECTION

RICH FRUIT CAKE

CLASS 3

INGREDIENTS

2 cups sultanas

11/2 cups chopped seeded raisins

1 cups currants

½ cup chopped mixed peel

½ cup chopped red glaced cherries

½ cup chopped blanched almonds

½ cup sherry or brandy or rum

2 cups plain flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

½ teaspoon ground ginger

½ teaspoon ground cloves

1/4 teaspoon salt

250g butter

11/2 cups soft brown sugar

4 eggs

2 tablespoons marmalade

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

½ teaspoon lemon essence

METHOD

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy or rum, cover and leave for at least one hour but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flour, salt and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences and marmalade.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm and bake in a slow oven for approximately 21/2 - 3 hours. Watch oven temperatures as some ovens vary.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE

To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries 4 to 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

Needlework Tapestry (Canvas Work) Stitching covers the complete surface. Worked on embroidery canvas-single or double thread or even weave fabric, with cross stitch, half stitch petit point, any other canvas work stitch/or combinations.

Petit Point is worked on fine canvas, linen or gauze, with a count of not less than seven threads per centimetre, the background need not be stitched.

COUNTED WORK

These embroideries are worked by counting the threads of the fabric. Such techniques include Assisi Blackwork, Pattern Darning, Pulled fabric, Drawn thread, Cut and drawn, Hardanger, etc.

CROSS STITCH

Cross Stitch is a separate technique.

SURFACE STITCHERY

Surface Stitchery refers to all embroideries worked freely across the surface of the fabric without the necessity of counting threads.





HORSE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All competition at this show is governed by these regulations and by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au. Peak body rules apply to some disciplines as outlined on the schedule page for each discipline. Should it become necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW shows.

INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS: The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying Wentworth Show Society Inc and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age and any other individual expected to interact with horses during the show. ALSO, all competitors must complete a Horse Health Declaration, each horse with which the competitor has bought onto the Showgrounds must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show.

- 1. All those entering the arena at Wenworth Show are required to obtain a wrist band from the Horse Shed prior to entering the arena regardless of age or intended activity as evidence of completion of waiver forms. Any person not wearing a wrist band may be asked to leave the arena immediately and will forfeit all entries until such time as they have obtained a wrist band from the Horse Shed.
- Accidents: Competitors are required to advise the Chief Steward and the Horse Shed of any falls or injuries and complete Incident Form immediately after the incident.
- Under Saddle Age Limit: The ASC recommends a lower age limit of 3 years of age (as at the date of the competition) for leading rein and 5 years of age for independent riding.
- 4. Entry: Must be completed online at http://showday. online/ at a cost of \$4.00 per class unless otherwise stated in this schedule.
- Late Entries: Are triple the cost of the entry fee and will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Steward only at the Horse Shed.
- 6. Scratching: Competitors are required to advise the Ring Steward or the Horse Shed that they are withdrawing from a class as soon as practicable. In the event of a scratching, entries fees will be forfeited and are unable to be transferred to another class or competitor.
- There will be no entry fees refunded after the closing date unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of completion of event.
- Competitors must advise the Horse Shed of any changes to their entries. Failure to do so will result in an invoice being issued, which must be paid before prize money will be distributed.
- 9. Refusal of Entry/Alteration of Schedule/Prizes: The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason for doing so and to alter the schedule to meet emerging circumstances. The Society is not responsible for the non-delivery of Sponsor's trophies/prizes. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right to isolate, refuse entry to and/or remove the exhibit from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
- Prizes: The committee reserves the right to decline to pay prize money on classes with less than four competitors.

- 11. Judge's Decision/Discretion: The judge is empowered to withhold any or all prizes in any class where the exhibits are, in his/her opinion, unworthy of the prize, and at all times the judge's decision will be final. A judge has the discretion to ask that a led or performance exhibit and handler / rider / driver be ordered to leave the ring if he/she considers the animal is unruly and/or likely to cause an accident.
- 12. Approaching Judges: No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging except through the Chief Steward.
- **13.** The Judges decision is final. Please follow the protest protocol outlined below.
- 14. District/Local Classes: Horses and/or riders must have been resident for at least three months prior to the show within an 80-kilometre radius of the Showground.
- **15.** Novice Class Eligibility: A Novice has not won a First Place at any Show in a similar class.
- Intermediate: An Intermediate rider has not won a first, second or third prize at any Royal Show.
- 17. Ridden Show Hunters and Ridden Show Hacks: At the beginning of each calendar year an exhibitor MUST choose the category for their exhibit, EITHER Show Hunter or Show Hack, when competing at an Ag Shows NSW Affiliated Agricultural Show or supplementary event.
- Ridden Show Hunters: Hack, Galloway, Pony: Horses in Show Hunter classes may not also compete in Ridden Show Hack classes.
- Ridden Show Hacks Hack, Galloway, Pony: Horses in Show Hack classes may not also compete in Show Hunter classes.
- 20. Stallions: Stallions must be wearing a bit at all times when being led and must be under the control of a person 18 years of age or older. Stallions must be clearly identifiable per Equestrian Australia's Stallion Safe Practice & Identification guidelines. They must be supervised at all times and securely fastened when tied to the outside of a truck or float. They are not eligible to compete in ridden classes unless their eligibility is specifically stated in the schedule.
- Ponies with Adult Riders: Ponies may be ridden by adults unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
- 22. Lateness to the Ring: Competitors must be ready when called. Once judging has commenced, a competing horse shall not be led, ridden or driven into or out of the judging ring without the permission of the judge and/or the Chief Steward.
- 23. Leaving The Ring: If a led horse should drag or escape its handler or a ridden or driven horse take control of or unseat its rider and leave the ring, it is usually disqualified from the class.
- 24. Horse Measuring: No official measuring will take place at the show, but, if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be at the absolute discretion of the Chief Steward.
- 25. Breed Registration: Registration documents for horses in breed classes must be produced when required by a Steward. It is the competitor/owner's responsibility to ensure relevant memberships for their exhibits Breed society or registry is financial at time of competition.
- **26.** Attire: Competitors must be appropriately attired for the competition in which they are competing.
- 27. Helmets: Every rider is encouraged to wear a safety helmet compliant with the current Equestrian Australia approve safety standards for helmets, some classes require helmets to be worn per their discipline rules. Riders under 18 years must wear such a helmet at all times when mounted or in the arena. Please visit www. equestrian.org.au for more information.
- **28.** Footwear: All competitors must wear appropriate footwear when leading or riding a horse. When riding, the footwear must enable removal of the foot from the stirrup.

- 29. Cruelty: Persons who are considered by the Chief Steward to be abusive or cruel to a horse will be expelled from the ground. No horse will be permitted to compete if, in the opinion of the Chief Steward, it is in poor health or condition.
- 30. Drugs: Drug testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC disputes & disciplinary regulation will be investigated by the ASC disciplinary committee. Where a horse or rider is registered with a peak body, the test results may be passed to that peak body.
- 31. Unsafe animals: If a horse is out of control and deemed unsafe by a Judge and/or the Chief Steward it must be removed from the Showgrounds as soon as practicable at the expense of the exhibitor.
- **32.** Prohibited Relationship: No competitor will present for judging before a judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has or has recently had a personal relationship or has had horse related business dealings during the past twelve months.
- 33. Coaching: Any person detected coaching a competitor while that competitor is being judged may be removed from the Showground. All coaching is prohibited at the Wentworth Showground for the duration of the show.
- **34.** Proper Conduct: Any person who behaves offensively on the Showground may be expelled from the ground. The matter may be investigated by the Society or/and ASC Disciplinary committee and penalties may be imposed.
- 35. Protests: A protest or complaint against any exhibit or exhibitor may be lodged in writing with the Chief Steward no later than sixty minutes after the judging of the exhibit or exhibitor. The Chief Steward must be provided with the exact nature of the complaint and act, if necessary, to maintain competitive fairness. The Chief Steward may choose to refer the matter to the Protests Committee, which shall comprise the President of the Society, or a Vice President and two other members of the General Committee. A protest or complaint or an appeal against the decision of the Chief Steward may be lodged in writing with the Secretary no later than 6 pm on the day of judging. Such protest, complaint or appeal shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which shall be forfeited if the protest, complaint, or appeal proves to be frivolous or vexatious. A matter lodged this way shall be dealt with by the Protests Committee within 24 hours of lodgement and the decision of the Protest Committee shall be final. No protest or complaint will be considered if it refers simply to a judge's decision.
- **36.** Veterinary Costs: In the case of an exhibit requiring veterinary inspection/treatment whilst at this event exhibitors agree that all costs incurred are their responsibility.
- **37.** Age of Horses: The age of all horses shall be calculated from 1st August in the year in which it was foaled.
- **38.** Over Mounting: will not be tolerated. Riders deemed to be too tall or too heavy will not be permitted at the Judge's discretion.
- 39. Equestrian Australia Classes: All Horses, Riders & Owners must be registered with Equestrian Australia to be eligible to compete in Offical & Junior classes. A copy of current EA Certificate or Registration must be produced up on request. Current Performance Cards must be available on request. Prize money will be withheld until documents are presented.
- **40.** Exit requirements: Competitors are responsible for cleaning up their area prior to leaving the Wentworth Showgrounds.
- Competitors are prohibited from tying horses to running rail at any time.
- **42.** Emergency vehicle access must be kept clear at all times.
- **43.** Dogs are not permitted on Wentworth Showgrounds.
- 44. Drones are not permitted at Wentworth Show
- **45.** Unregistered electric vehicles are prohibited on Wentworth Showgrounds with the exception of approved mobility aids.

- 46. Wentworth Show Society Inc will not tolerate any unreasonable behaviour towards judges, stewards or any other Wentworth Show Society volunteers. This includes bullying, harassment, adverse behaviour or offensive language. Any person involved in these sorts of behaviours will be escorted from the showgrounds at the discretion of the disputes committee and may be banned from future shows.
- 47. Wentworth Show Society Inc will not tolerate any malicious comments made on social media or elsewhere which includes, but is not limited to; Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, TikTok, Blogs, Forums, Discussion Boards and Groups (public, private or restricted), which may ultimately bring Wentworth Show Society Inc, it's events, volunteers, sponsors and competitors into disrepute. Every instance will be investigated and action may be taken.

STABLING CONDITIONS OF USE

- Stabling applications to be made through https:// showday.online/ with entries.
- 2. Stable bookings will be confirmed before the show.
- Stables, stalls and portable panels are used at the risk of the handler or exhibitor. Wentworth Show Society accepts no responsibility for any injury or damage suffered as a result of the use of stables, stalls and portable panels.
- 4. Stallion Stables are limited to the Stockman's Memorial Shed and will be available to Stallions only. If your Stallion is unable to be stabled with other Stallions, you are required to make alternative arrangements.
- No horse is to be put in a stable or stall without consent of the Chief Steward.
- Stable allocations will be available from the Stabling Steward and the Horse Shed at the show.
- 7. Preference will be given to long distance travellers.
- 8. Stables must be cleaned at the end of the show. Failure to do so may result in a cleaning charge equivalent to the cost of the clean up and loss of allocation at future shows.
- Repairs to damaged stables and portable panels will be charged to hirer.

CAMPING CONDITIONS OF USE

- Camping applications to be made through https:// showday.online/ with entries.
- 2. Camping bookings will be confirmed before the show.
- 3. All electrical leads & equipment must be currently tested & tagged by a licensed tester.
- 4. All leads to be covered or disconnected during the day.
- 5. Fires are permitted on the Wentworth Showgrounds under strict conditions and only with consent from the Chief Stewards. Firewood will not be supplied. Fires must be set no less than 400mm above ground level and contained at all times. Fires safety equipment must be kept on hand
- 6. Campers are responsible for cleaning up their area prior to departure. Failure to clean up may result in a cleaning charge equivalent to the cost of the clean up and loss of allocation at future shows.
- Campers are required to act within NSW laws, rules and regulations for public facilities at all times whilst camping at Wentworth Showgrounds.

- RESTRICTED TESTS will be the most recent released by Equestrian Australia. Riders and horses need not be registered with EA. Mount size is not restricted.
- 11. JUNIOR RIDER TESTS will be the most recent released by Equestrian Australia. Riders are elligible from 10yrs to 18 yrs, or for 8 yrs if riding a pony.
- 12. PONY TESTS will be the most recent released by EA. Pony Dressage Tests are open to all riders competing on ponies / galloways meeting the height requirement. Mount size is restricted to 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes. Riders / Ponies need not be registered with EA. The estimated height of the pony is to be included on the entry form.

- **13.** Horses may only compete at two (2) consecutive levels e.g. Novice/Elementary. Each horse is restricted to a maximum of two (2) tests. In accordance with EA rulings, a horse must be a minimum of three (3) years of age to compete.
- 14. Riding Attire
 - a. Approved helmets must be worn per Equestrian Australia rules. See current EA National Dressage Rules and Approved Safety Standards for Helmets at www.equestrian.org.au.
 - Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.
 - New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.
 - iii. Current American standard ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onward) provided they are SELmarked.
 - iv. Current American standard SNELL E2014 Current British standard PAS 045 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI kitemarked
 - v. Interim European Stand G1 (0 .00 2014 12)
 - **b.** Approved short or long riding boots gloves, collared & sleeved shirt & generally a new and lidy appearance is required.
 - c. If gaiters/chappettes are work, the exposed side must be full grain teamer; suede on the exposed side is not permitted.
 - d. Official combinations, compulsory dress as per the rules, Except tration & Bridle No. required. All hases and iders must be gear checked prior to or immediately after competing in each test. Failure to do so may incur elimination.
- 15. Callers are allowed.
- Results will be displayed outside the horse shed on the day.
- 17. Appeals must be made in writing and submitted within half an hour of the Competition concluding. Appeals cost \$50, which will be refunded only if the appeal is upheld.
- 18. No refund of entry fees will be given after the closing date. 50% of entry fees will be refunded if a veterinary or medical certificate is produced no later than 24 hours after the event.
- **19.** Please notify any scratching ASAP to help with the smooth running of the event.
